Local Law No. ___ of 2023

(A Local Law Providing Updated Qualifications for Department Heads and Deputies)

Section 1: Legislative Intent

The Supervisor and Town Board have been pleased with the dedication and performance of the Town's staff. Like any business would, the Town must make sure all of its departments are appropriately staffed, and that should staff members retire or find alternative employment, that the Town has other employees ready to fill these voids.

Section 2: Addition of New Provisions to Chapter 27: Officers and Employees

New Provisions shall be added to Chapter 27: Officers and Employees as Article III: "Department Heads and Deputies", as follows:

All Department Heads and Deputies shall meet the following qualifications:

- 1. All licensed professionals shall have at least five (5) years of relevant experience. Any Department Head or Deputy whose position does not require a licensed professional shall have experience satisfactory to the Town Board.
- 2. Be a resident of the State of New York.
- 3. Be appointed by the Town Board.

Section 3. Severability

If any section or subdivision, paragraph, clause, or phrase of this local law shall be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, any judgment made thereby shall not affect the validity of this law as a whole or any part thereof other than the part or provision so adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 4. State Provisions

Pursuant to the authority of the Town Board under the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law, this chapter supersedes and replaces §§ 20 and 23 of the Town Law and Public Officers Law § 3, including, but not limited to, residency requirements, as they are applicable to the Town of East Fishkill.

Section 5. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, the lowest qualified bid is from Legacy Supply, Inc.; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby declares and Authorizes Nicholas D'Alessandro, Town Supervisor, be provided the authority to authorize a contract with Legacy Supply, Inc. for the services described in WS2023.02 FOUR CORNERS WATER DISTRICT WELL 5.

The Town of East Fishkill operates the Four Corners Water District. The District has a shortfall of water source. Subsequently, the Town has already declared a State of Emergency for the Water District. The Water and Sewer Department has been working for multiple years to establish Well #5 as an additional water source. Well #5 is expected to deliver about 60 gpm or 86,400 gallons per day. Both the NYSDEC and the Dutchess County Department of Health are in the process of issuing permits for the use of Well #5. The Water and Sewer Department would like to commence construction of the new well as soon as possible.

The Town Clerk received two (2) bids for the publicly advertised project for the construction and connection of Well #5. The Town has successfully worked with both Contractors on previous projects in the Town. It is expected that the construction duration will be about 3 months. In addition to securing a contractor to perform the well installation and connection, the Town has also purchased several materials that require long lead times, especially in the current supply chain environment. The Contractor will be utilizing the purchased materials.

The two bid results are as follows;

Contractor Name	Lump Sum Fee
Legacy Supply, Inc.	\$297,976.00
Eventus Construction Co., Inc.	\$347,500.00

As mentioned, in addition to the Construction Contractor, the Town has also purchased several long lead materials to help expedite the construction process. The summation of the fees for the Contractor, Materials, Contingency, and Engineering Consulting Services, we estimate the total to be approximately \$297,976 + \$22,000 + 35,000 + \$90,000 = \$444,976 - SAY \$445,000. This total does not include the initial well drilling and professional services to establish the well location and preliminary testing. Please note that Well #5 is part of a long term solution for providing additional water to the Water District.

It is our recommendation to advance a budget of \$450,000 to complete the Well #5 project at Four Corners. It is also our recommendation to authorize the Town Supervisor, on behalf of the Town Board, to finalize a contract with Legacy Supply, Inc. in the amount of \$297,976.00.

WHEREAS, the Town of East Fishkill previously authorized seeking bids for the rehabilitation of the two wells, with an estimated budget of \$100,000; and

WHEREAS, the Town publicly advertised and received bid return on March 16, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the lowest, qualified bid is from Weston & Sampson CMR, Inc. dba SB Church; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby declares and Authorizes Nicholas D'Alessandro, Town Supervisor, be provided the authority to authorize a contract with Weston and Sampson CMR, Inc dba SB Church for the services described in WS2023.03 FISHKILL PLAINS WATER DISTRICT WELL 1 & WELL 2 REHABILITATION.

Subject: Fishkill Plains Well #1 & Well #2 Rehabilitation

The Town of East Fishkill operates the Fishkill Plains Water District. The District includes two active wells and third well for future water supply. All of the wells are located in the vicinity water treatment plant, at Wright Blvd. During the past few years, the wells have experienced a loss in well water production. It is typical for wells to decline in well production over time. The Water and Sewer Department previously recommended that the wells be redeveloped, a maintenance activity, to return the well production to it's historic higher yield. As such, the Town Board authorized a public bid for service to redevelop the wells. These wells serve Fishkill Plains, Brettview, Revere Park, and Hopewell West Water Districts.

The Town received one bid during this time period from Weston and Sampson CMR, Inc. dba SB Church. The bid amount is \$94,346.00. We did receive phone calls from other companies qualified to perform the work. However, they all stated that they are understaffed and generally already booked for services almost to the end of 2023. The Town also recently authorized the same Bidder to perform well rehabilitation work at the Four Corners Well #4 for a fee of \$39,488.00 of a single well.

The Water and Sewer Department is of the opinion that the bid fee is a reasonable fee, given the market climate that is being experienced. SB Church previously redeveloped the well about a decade earlier. The Water and Sewer Department is of the opinion that the Town Board should authorize the proposal of services from Weston and Sampson CMR, Inc. dba SB Church in the amount of \$94,346.00. Once authorized, this work will be scheduled in the next few months.

(DESIGNATE APRIL AS PARKINSON'S AWARENESS MONTH)

WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is a progressive neurological movement disorder of the central nervous system, which has a unique impact on each patient; and

WHEREAS, according to the Parkinson's Action Network, the Parkinson's Disease Foundation, the American Parkinson's Disease Association and the National Institutes of Health, there are over one million Americans diagnosed with Parkinson's disease; and

WHEREAS, symptoms include slowness, tremor, difficulty with balance and speaking, rigidity, cognitive and memory problems; and

WHEREAS, although new medicines and therapies may enhance life for some time for people with Parkinson's, more work is needed for a cure; and

WHEREAS, increased education and research are needed to help find more effective treatments with fewer side effects and ultimately a cure for Parkinson's disease; and

WHEREAS, a multidisciplinary approach to Parkinson's disease care includes local wellness, support, and caregiver groups; and

WHEREAS, April has been proclaimed as World Wide Parkinson's Awareness Month for all to recognize the need for more research and help in dealing with the devastating effects of Parkinson's disease.

The Town of East Fishkill in conjunction with their Traffic Consultant, HVEA Engineers, has reviewed the Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis for NYS Route 52 and Roethal Drive completed by Langan Engineering and dated November 29, 2022. This Analysis included the evaluation of traffic conditions resulting from the adjacent development of a 540,000 SF warehouse known as Hudson Valley Logistics Center (HVLC) located south of Route 52 at Roethal Drive and current corridor improvements including the creation of Patriot Way (formally Auditorium Drive) as a Town Road bypass from Route 52 to Interstate 84, a new modern roundabout at Route 52 Patriot Way and the development of a new student drop-off area on Patriot Way for John Jay High School. These improvements are expected to be operational prior to the end of the year.

The Town agrees with Langan Engineering's conclusion that a traffic signal is not warranted at the intersection of NYS Route 52 and Roethal Drive based on future traffic conditions of HVLC and current corridor improvements. The existing signal currently at this location is not operational and has been out of operation for over 15 years. Facial Hair: Employees will be permitted to wear goatees or beards that are maintained at a length and pattern so as not to detract from the officer's professional appearance.

- 1. Beards must be edged and trimmed above and below and shall not be permitted below the Adam's apple or on the neck. The bulk of the beard (distance that the mass of facial hair protrudes from the skin of the face) shall not exceed one half (1/2) inch. The mustache will be trimmed in a manner as not to conceal any portion of the top lip.
- 2. Full and partial beards are authorized; but patchy, spotty clumps of facial hair are not considered beards and, as such, are not permitted. The immediate supervisor will have the authority to deem an employee's facial hair appropriate.
- 3. If only a mustache is worn, the lowest point of the mustache will be no lower than the lowest point of the top lip and it will be trimmed in a manner as not to conceal any portion of the top lip.
- 4. Sworn personnel working in undercover assignments, or specialized assignments requiring facial hair not otherwise authorized by this policy, shall be exempt from these restrictions at the discretion of the Chief of Police.
- 5. Sworn members will not be permitted to wear a beard or goatee during their employment probationary period. The probationary period will be completed at the end of one service year from the sworn member's hire date.
