

BOIL WATER NOTICE

A problem is present in the Four Corners Water District

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Bring tap water to a rolling boil, boil for one minute, and cool before using, or use bottled water certified for sale by the New York State Department of Health. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and preparing food until further notice.

This Boil Water Notice applies to all customers of the Four Corners Water District.

What Happened?

Starting Tuesday, February 24, 2026, it was discovered that the roof of storage tank for the water system had sustained damage due to the storm on Monday February 23, 2026. Due to this damage, there is a potential for bacteria and other microorganisms to enter the treated water. As a precaution, a boil water notice is in effect until further notice.

What is being done?

The Town of East Fishkill is working with the storage tank manufacturer and in consultation with the Dutchess County Department of Health to correct the issue with the tank. Throughout the boil water notice, VRI Environmental Services will be collecting additional Total Coliform Samples that are required by the Dutchess County Department of Health. You will receive another notice letting you know when the water is safe to drink.

You will be informed when satisfactory repairs have been made and tests show that you no longer need to boil your water.
